

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NEW ENGLAND CULINARY INSTITUTE FINANCIAL AID PROCESS

Federal Financial Aid Information

If you would like to be considered for federal, state and institutional need-based aid, you must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) electronically, and at no charge, at www.fafsa.gov. NECI's school code is 015904. You will receive an email with a link to your processed FAFSA.

You and a parent (if you are a dependent student) will first need to apply for a PIN (Personal Identification Number) at www.pin.ed.gov prior to signing the FAFSA.

The FAFSA data is used to determine your eligibility for a Federal Pell Grant, Federal Supplemental Opportunity Grant (FSEOG), Federal Work Study, Federal Direct Stafford Loans, Federal Perkins Loan, Federal Direct PLUS Loan, state grant programs and institutional need based aid. Be aware that some state agencies require you to complete an additional state grant application as well. Check with the [Financial Aid Office](#) or Admissions Office if you are unsure about what year FAFSA you should complete.

Financial aid eligibility is determined by information provided on the FAFSA form and any required documentation according to your program and enrollment. Financial aid is awarded by the academic year which typically consists of three 13-week terms in the on ground credit based programs, 26 weeks for the Certificate Programs and six classes for the on line program. Financial aid is disbursed to your account by term.

Types of Federal Student Aid

Federal Pell Grants are need-based gift aid that does not need to be repaid. Pell Grants are awarded to eligible students with financial need who are pursuing their first undergraduate degree. The maximum Pell Grant for 2015-2016 is \$5,775

Federal Supplemental Opportunity Grants (FSEOG) is a need-based grant available to Pell-eligible students only. The school determines the award amount each year based upon the availability of funds.

Federal Work Study (FWS) is a federal need-based work opportunity and based on the Expected Family Contribution on your processed FAFSA. The school determines the eligibility and award amount each year based upon the availability of funds. Work Study positions are posted with the Student Services Office for both on and off campus opportunities. A position is not

guaranteed. If a student is determined eligible for FWS, the student will earn a bi-weekly paycheck for hours worked to be used for personal expenses. The earnings should be excluded from the following year's FAFSA data.

Federal Direct Subsidized Loan awards are federal need-based loans. Interest does not accrue while the student is enrolled at least half time. The six-month grace period begins as soon as a student falls below half-time status. The interest rate as of July 1, 2015 is **4.29%**. Loan levels are set by the government based on academic year in school.

Federal Direct Unsubsidized Loan awards are federal non-need-based loans and available regardless of financial need. Interest accrues while a student is enrolled in school. Interest is deferred while a student is enrolled at least half time in school. The interest is capitalized (added to the principal balance) at the end of the six-month grace period. The interest rate as of July 1, 2015 is **4.29%**.

There is a limit to the total amount of Subsidized and Unsubsidized Stafford Loans that a student may receive. For more information, visit www.studentloans.gov

Federal Direct Parent PLUS Loan program is a borrowing option for parents of dependant undergraduate students. Financial need is not a requirement for borrowing a PLUS loan. Parents can borrow up to the financial aid cost of attendance minus all financial aid awards. The interest rate is fixed on a PLUS loan and is currently **6.84%**. A positive credit history is required. The PLUS application and loan promissory note can be completed electronically at www.studentloans.gov

The Master Promissory Note: All Federal Direct Loan borrowers are required to complete a Master Promissory Note. An electronic Master Promissory Note can be completed online at www.studentloans.gov. You will need your FAFSA PIN to log in to the federal loan website.

Internship Earnings

Your educational program may consist of one or more internship opportunities. Your earnings (average \$6,720 based on 700 hour internship) are an important financial resource to help offset institutional charges and reduce the amount of student loan borrowing.

Federal Education Credits such as Hope, American Opportunity, Lifetime Learning Credits, Student Loan Interest Deduction and Tuition and Fees Deduction may be available to you when filing your Federal Tax Return. Refer to your tax advisor for eligibility requirements or visit www.irs.gov

NECI Financial Aid Office Code of Conduct

New England Culinary Institute, in compliance with the Higher Education Opportunity Act, has established this code of conduct prohibiting conflicts of interest for its financial aid personnel. All employees in the Office of Financial Aid, as well as all officers, employees and agents of the college are required to comply with this code of conduct.

1. The institution, the college's individual employees and officers and all college agents, are prohibited from entering into any revenue-sharing arrangements with any lender.
2. Any officer, employee or agent of NECI who has responsibilities with respect to education loans, is prohibited from soliciting or accepting any gift from a lender, guarantor, or servicer of education loans. The term "gift" means any gratuity, discount, hospitality, loan, or other item having more than a minimal monetary value.
3. Any officer, employee or agent of NECI who has responsibilities with respect to education loans, is prohibited from engaging in any contractual arrangement with any lender or affiliate of a lender that results in any financial benefit.
4. NECI does not direct borrowers to a particular lender.
5. NECI does not refuse to certify or delay certification of any loan based on the borrower's selection of lender.
6. NECI does not accept from any lender any offer of funds to be used for private education loans.
7. NECI does not accept from any lender any assistance with call center staffing or Office of Financial Aid staffing.
8. Any officer, employee or agent of NECI who has responsibilities with respect to education loans,

and who serves on an advisory board, commission, or group established by a lender, guarantor, or group of lenders or guarantors, is prohibited from receiving any type of compensation, except for reimbursement of reasonable expenses incurred.

As members of the National Association of Student Financial Aid Administrators (NASFAA), NECI financial aid personnel also adhere to the NASFAA Statement of Ethical Principles and Code of Conduct which contains principles specific to the financial aid profession. Consistent with the requirements of the Higher Education Opportunity Act (HEOA) and the provisions of the NECI Code of Conduct and the NASFAA statement, NECI has adopted this Code of Conduct for their financial aid professionals.

APPLY FOR STATE GRANTS

Vermont residents can apply for a Vermont State Grant by visiting [VSAC](#) online, or by calling 800.798.8722 to request a paper application. State grant applications are usually available after the first of the year and some have specific application deadlines. Students from outside of Vermont should check with their state higher education authority about the availability of state grants, eligibility requirements, and application process. RESEARCH AND APPLY FOR SCHOLARSHIPS

NECI Merit Scholarships are available for residential and online degree programs. **They are not available for the Certificate Programs.**

To apply for NECI scholarships, all required documentation must be submitted to the Admissions Office via [email](#), fax, or mail prior to your initial financial aid offer.

New England Culinary Institute reserves the right to revise your initial award offer if you receive outside resources or if you become eligible for additional institutional scholarships .

New England Culinary Institute Scholarships

Academic Excellence Scholarship

The Academic Excellence Scholarship is awarded to students who have demonstrated exceptional academic achievement in high school. The Academic Excellence Scholarship can be used for any term during the year following high school completion. Criteria:

- Acceptance to New England Culinary Institute
- 3.5+ Grade Point Average*
- Cannot be combined with competition scholarships

Amount: \$6,000.00 total award (\$2,000.00/residency enrollment). Renewable upon academic completeness and on-time return as scheduled for the following academic years.

Culinary Excellence Scholarship

The Culinary Excellence Scholarship is awarded to students who have participated in a high school level culinary program. The Culinary Excellence Scholarship can be used for any term during the year following high school completion.

Criteria:

- Acceptance to New England Culinary Institute
- 3.0+ Grade Point Average*
- Participation in a culinary curriculum during high school
- Cannot be combined with competition scholarships
- Cannot be combined with Academic Excellence Scholarship

Amount: \$6,000.00 total award (\$2,000.00/residency enrollment). Renewable upon academic completeness and on-time return as scheduled for the following academic years.

*All awards made prior to the completion of high school are subject to GPA verification upon receipt of a student's final official transcript.

Dual Enrollment Scholarship

The Dual Enrollment Scholarship is available to students who have been recommended by their chef instructors or a guidance counselor to participate in an online course offered by New England Culinary Institute, as well a weekend experience on campus. Upon successful completion of high school, the online coursework, and the residency experience, students will be awarded The renewable Dual Enrollment Scholarship.

Amount: \$12,000.00 maximum award
(\$4,000.00/per academic year)

Renewable upon academic completeness and on time return as scheduled for the following academic years.

The Dual Enrollment Scholarship cannot be combined with other New England Culinary Institute merit-based awards. The Dual Enrollment Scholarship may be combined with other competition scholarships at the discretion of the Financial Aid Office.

James Jeffords Life Long Learner Scholarship

The Life Long Learner Scholarship is available to students who have already obtained a bachelor's degree or higher and are pursuing either a career change or exploring opportunities in the culinary industry.

Amount: \$6,000.00 total award
(\$2,000.00/per residency enrollment)

Application Process: Please send a copy of your diploma or transcript and a letter describing why you have chosen to attend New England Culinary Institute via fax, [email](#), or mail indicating that you are applying for the Life Long Learner Scholarship.

Renewable upon academic completeness and on time return as scheduled for the following academic years.

Daniel Guthrie Outstanding Student Scholarship

Returning NECI students are invited to contact the Financial Aid office to be considered for the Daniel Guthrie award prior to their second or third year of study. All scholarship material must be received 30 days prior to the start of residency term to be considered for the award.

Criteria:

- Exceeds standards in 75% of completed courses.
- Complete in all previously attempted coursework.
- Letter of reference from internship site.

- Letter from applicant describing the positive impact that they had on the NECI community during their prior residency term.

Amount: \$2,000.00 one-time award.

Application Process: Please send a letter of application and an employer letter of recommendation to the Financial Aid Office via fax, [email](#), or mail.

Phillip Cooke Industry Professional Scholarship

The Industry Professional Scholarship is awarded to students who have three or more years of professional experience in the culinary industry.

Criteria:

- 3 + years of full-time experience working in the hospitality industry
- Resume including employer contact information
- Letter of recommendation from an employer

Amount: \$6,000.00 total award
(\$2,000.00/per residency period)

Renewable upon academic completeness and on-time return as scheduled for the following academic years.

Application Process: Please send resume and letter of recommendation to the Admissions Office indicating that you are applying for the Industry Professional Scholarship.

Alumni Referral Award

If a New England Culinary Institute graduate has referred you to the school, please encourage them to visit the New England Culinary Institute Alumni website so that they can fill out the Next Generation Scholarship form on your behalf. The Financial Aid office must receive this form before the Financial Aid Award letter is generated. New England Culinary Institute graduates that are current employees of New England Culinary Institute are not eligible as a reference.

Amount: \$2,000.00 one-time award

Partners in Success Award

The Partners in Success Scholarship is awarded to accepted students who New England Culinary has received a written referral from a guidance counselor or current or former instructor.

Amount: \$1,000.00 one-time award

Amount: \$1,000.00 total award (\$500 awarded upon successful completion of each academic year.)

APPLYING FOR ALTERNATIVE STUDENT LOANS

Alternative Loans (Private Education Loans)

Alternative loans are offered by private lenders and have their own eligibility criteria. Alternative loans typically have a variable interest rate that is tied either to the LIBOR or the Prime lending rate. Alternative loan fees and interest rates can vary widely. These variations are typically based on the borrower and cosigner's credit rating. Student borrowers may need to have a credit-worthy cosigner in order to obtain an alternative loan. Repayment terms and borrowing amounts vary by lender.

It is the applicant's obligation to report all outside scholarships, vocational rehabilitation benefits and tuition assistance to the Financial Aid Office as these are counted as financial aid resource. New England Culinary reserves the right to adjust financial aid packages based on additional information.

ACADEMIC TERMS AT NEW ENGLAND CULINARY INSTITUTE

An Academic Year does not Equal 12 Calendar Months.

To meet accreditation requirements, all NECI programs must be designed to deliver a certain amount of coursework in a specific amount of time. This is called an academic year and is not related to a 12-month calendar year.

Academic years are condensed at NECI due to its intensive, year-round programs. This allows students to qualify for federal financial aid more than once in a 12-month calendar year. Students will be billed by term. Tuition and fees are outlined by academic year in the NECI catalog and in the enrollment agreement that each student signs at time of registration.

AOS & BA Programs

An academic year consists of three modules, each lasting 3 months.

Online BA Programs

An academic year consists of six classes of continuous enrollment.

Certificate Programs

Total length of this program is 26 weeks consisting of a 13 week residency and 13 week internship.

NOTICE OF FEDERAL STUDENT FINANCIAL AID PENALTIES FOR DRUG LAW VIOLATIONS

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Tuition and Fees

Tuition Coverage

Tuition covers the cost of instruction, evaluation, standard administrative processing, use of school facilities and membership at a local health club. Students enrolled in on-ground courses while on internship will be subject to additional tuition charges, fees, and depending on living arrangements, room and board.

Materials, Supplies and Textbooks

Students are supplied with their uniforms, aprons and hats. Students are also supplied with either a knife kit or a pastry kit depending on the program.

To ensure each student has the necessary materials for their chosen program, NECI orders each student a standard materials package of uniforms and culinary tools. The cost of this package is included in NECI Materials and Knife Kit fee. Materials and/or Knife Kits are available for pick-up subsequent to registration. Refunds are not provided for unused materials.

NOTE: Students are responsible for purchasing textbooks and footwear. A list of program specific textbooks and the estimated cost is available at www.neci.edu/student-life/student-support/student-resources.

Changes to Tuition and Fees

Students are provided preliminary charges for tuition, room, board, fees and materials during the admissions process. New England Culinary Institute may adjust charges, excluding materials and uniform, up to 60 days prior to registration. Materials and uniform charges vary due to market costs and may change up to the date of registration.

Deposits

A deposit of \$300 is required to secure a place in the program. The deposit is applied against the account balance once registered. NECI retains \$150 of the deposit should the student cancel their enrollment prior to beginning the term.

Students living in on-campus housing must provide a room deposit of \$200, refundable at term end upon satisfactory room inspection. All students are also required to provide a \$100 library deposit refundable at term end if all library materials have been returned.

Student Accounts

Any student who fails to comply with the school's financial policies including payment schedules, other written payment arrangements, payment of fines and other charges may be dismissed from the program or prohibited from graduating. Transcripts will not be issued for students or alumni with unpaid student accounts or for any students on financial probation or hold.

Residency Requirement: First Year Students

All first year students are required to live in on-campus housing. Students with extenuating circumstances may submit a written request for waiver of this requirement to Housing@neci.edu. After the first year, students who choose to live off campus, will not incur room charges but continue to be responsible for required residency board. Students also receive a membership to our local gym "First in Fitness" <http://www.firstinfitness.com>.

Health Insurance

The School requires all students carry adequate health insurance to cover, among other costs, hospitalization and outpatient diagnostic and surgical procedures for both the residency and internship periods.

Students must satisfy the health insurance requirement in one of two ways:

Enroll in the NECI sponsored Student Health Insurance Plan, or apply for a waiver by certifying existing comparable coverage.

If a student chooses to maintain comparable coverage, a Waiver of Health Insurance form must be submitted to NECI Human Resources (HRPaperwork@neci.edu) no later than 14 days prior to the start of a term. Students must complete the Waiver process annually. If a Waiver of Health Insurance form is not received by the deadline, the student is automatically enrolled in the NECI sponsored Student Health Insurance Plan and held responsible for the applicable fees. Health Insurance Fees are charged per term, may be included in financial aid planning and are non-refundable to enrolled students. Final fees may vary based on coverage. Waiver forms are included in the enrollment package and are available from Human Resources.
